What are your old coins worth?

Millions of years ago, before he started *Sports Leisure*, Mark was a coin collector and even had a booth at the Roseville Auction Yard in his late teens. Now he's taken up collecting (and occasionally selling) coins and currency once again as a hobby. Here's where you come in.



Maybe you have a bag or a box of old coins. Perhaps you inherited a collection when a relative passed. Maybe it's just one or two coins or bills of currency you'd like to know about. If your coins are pre-1964 (50¢, 25¢, 10¢) or pre-1940

(pennies and nickels), or recent coins that are part of mintissued sets, they may have a premium value. Currency 1935 and before also fits into the "value" category.

But who/where can you take them to get an honest evaluation of their worth? Mark would be happy to give you a free appraisal. If you wish to sell your treasures, that is easy to arrange. Often Mark will offer to purchase them, or get you easily to someone who is interested. You can bring your coins to the office, or for larger heavier collections, Mark can come to you. Just call the office to set up an appointment. Feel free to share this offer with family and friends.

ACTIVITY METER 1 2 3 4 5

As part of our commitment to help you select the perfect vacation, refer to the Activity Meter rating to better understand how it matches your interests, energy and fitness level – 1 is the most leisurely while 5 represents what for many could be an overly-challenging adventure. It's important to note that more than one rating may apply to a tour. For example, some travelers will enjoy a visit to a national park by spending time in the visitors center and taking a seat with a view, whilst others prefer to hike a nature trail. Same destination and tour, but two different levels of activity.

The ratings can be found in the Table of Contents and on the itinerary page for each tour. Two numbers indicate the ability to do optional things which limit or increase the amount of physical activity required. This meter is only a guideline. With specific questions or requirements, call the office and speak to the tour planner.

Each level requires your ability to board and disembark a motorcoach without assistance.

- Leisurely A tour that can be enjoyed by all requiring a minimal amount of walking on city streets and generally level surfaces. There could be a few stairs. A theater daytrip is an example.
- Moderate A tour with some walking activities, standing/ strolling at attractions and museums, and some stair climbing. A daytrip to the ballpark or a museum exhibition, and short regional trips are examples. A moderate trip could include air or rail transportation and navigating through airports/stations.
- Active A tour which includes longer walks and/or walks on uneven surfaces. Days could be longer including air travel days with layovers. Some of your time could be spent at destinations with high altitudes. This is the level for most of our long-distance domestic and Canadian tours, vacations featuring national parks, and the minimum level for an overseas international trip. You should be able to walk 3-6 city blocks in a timely fashion a few times per day. You could find a flight of stairs without handrails, uneven nature trails and the like. Tours with a seaplane or jeep ride, and the ability to climb into the plane/jeep, along with longer rail journeys fall into this category.
- Energetic A tour with an emphasis on walking and other physical activities. Most overseas tours fit in this category, as well as many metropolitan domestic tours (New York and Washington, DC, especially). Expect long plane flights and walking longer distances at connections and/or customs. You might have to climb into a boat, carriage or train. You should not consider a tour on this level if you need wheelchair assistance at the airport or other places.
- Challenging Tours like these are designed with daily physical activities like hiking and other vigorous pursuits. They can be great travel experiences, but are not typical of most *Sports Leisure Vacations* trips.

In the afternoon, we offer a shuttle into town for shopping, lunch, etc. Lunch is also served at the resort. There are so many wonderful restaurants in town, we will dine together in one this evening. (FB,D)

3. 90 minutes south of Silverton is the town of Cottage Grove. It's home to 6 covered bridges, old time landmarks. Enjoy a narrated tour of this piece of history, and as a special treat, enjoy lunch on one of the bridges.

Home to the Ducks, University of Oregon, Eugene is a very diverse town. Our guided tour points out highlights like the signature neighborhoods and the reason it's called "Track Town USA." The campus is featured on the tour. Your accommodations for two nights are in one of Eugene's finest hotels. The Graduate – 2 nights (FB,L)

4. Junction City doesn't sound like it would be the Scandinavian capital of Oregon. But in the early 1900's, Danish farmers were attracted to the area, and today, over 100.000 attend the annual **Scandinavian** Festival and the different days of the event are dedicated to Norway, Finland, Sweden




and Denmark. Enjoy some great food, entertainment and festivities today as the local folks celebrate their heritage at the festival.

Back in Eugene, a visit to the Cascades Raptor Center gives you a look at 30 native species on display. This nature center and wildlife hospital specializes in birds of prey. Tonight, gather for a dinner honoring our travels together. (FB,D)

5. Before our early afternoon non-stop flight back to Sacramento, we have a lesson in glass-blowing with local artists. Perhaps you will create something worth taking home with vou... (FB)

- 2. Today is all about discovery. With a knowledgeable step on guide, we will experience the sights and sounds of Kings Canyon National Park. The park features deep canyons, towering cliffs, and some of the world's largest trees, the Giant Sequoias, including the famous General Grant Tree (which you will see). Return to your resort in mid-afternoon. Cocktail hour, dinner and a campfire under the stars offer a great way to end a wonderful day. (FB, L, D)
- 3. After breakfast, there's time for one last activity at the ranch. Then it's time to head for home. First stop is at the Forestiere Underground Gardens in Fresno. These gardens are a unique and fascinating network of subterranean rooms, courtyards, and passageways. They were hand-built by Baldassare Forestiere, a Sicilian immigrant, over a period of 40 years from 1906 to 1946. It's a fascinating story.


Before leaving Fresno, there's a stop for lunch, arriving at the Sports Leisure office in the late afternoon. (FB, L)

Hotel Encanto de Las Cruces (B,L)
- 4. White Sands National Monument is one of the world's great natural wonders. Explore the breathtaking wavelike dunes of snowwhite gypsum that stretch for 275 square miles. Learn how animals have adapted to live in this hot desert climate. Lunch is hosted at a historic lodge set high in a Ponderosa Pine forest (think Lake Tahoe) before arriving in the town of Carlsbad.
- Hampton Inn 2 nights (B,L)



Historic Fort Bragg, Training By The Ocean

Ride the old Skunk Train, enjoy North Coast Hospitality 4 Davs • July 14-17



We visited Fort Bragg for the first time in many years in 2024. Ten years ago, one of the tunnels used by the Skunk Train collapsed, and the town's major tourist attraction was crippled. Today, Ft. Bragg has reinvented itself, in a funky sort of way. We enjoyed our visit this past summer, except many on the trip lamented that it wasn't a day longer (this year's trip was 3 days). It's a bit of a drive to get there (and back).

There is so much history in the area, and because of its remote location, not everyone makes it up this way. The train still runs a short route into the redwoods. Come with us on a fun vacation to the coast!

1. From Sacramento we make our way up I-5 to Williams, then west on Route 20 into Lake County. Travel on to Willits for lunch with the Lumberjacks, arriving in Fort Bragg in mid-afternoon.

Your accommodations for three nights are at the Harbor Lite Lodge, with views overlooking Noyo Harbor below. Before



dinner, a short walking tour of some of the town's many murals is offered.

The city of Fort Bragg, yes, the whole city, is a California Historic Landmark, with the history of being a logging and mill town. Dinner at a popular local restaurant, with options including locally-caught seafood, brings the day to a close. (L,D)

- 2. After breakfast, our first stop on a busy Fort Bragg day is at the Mendocino Botanical Gardens. A docent leads us on a guided walk through the gardens, telling us the story of the couple who founded the site in 1961. Break for lunch at your leisure downtown, then board the train for the short ride to Pudding Creek in early afternoon. Back at your hotel, enjoy the view and a little down time. Dinner is included again this evening. (FB,D)

Ports of call:

Seattle is where we start our Alaska adventure. Puget Sound has incredible Pacific Northwest scenery. The beauty of the landscape is unforgettable from rocky outcroppings to forested mountains.

Scenic cruising Stephens Passage. The southern reaches of Stephens Passage offer one of the best whale watching areas in Alaska. The sound narrows as you are funneled into the passage, the mountains come right down into the sea. The water in the passage is ridiculously deep, well over 1,000 feet in places.

Juneau is the most remote, most beautiful, and most unusual state capital in the United States. Surrounded by water, forest, and mountains, visitors can hike a glacier, eat fresh caught fish on a seaside patio and tour a grand capital building all in one day.

Endicott Arm is a 30-mile fjord that snakes through the Tracy Arm Fords Wilderness area. At the head is the majestic Dawes Glacier. The 600-foot tall, mile wide Dawes Glacier takes center stage just around a bend. Endicott Arm and Dawes Glacier are the breeding grounds of harbor seals, one of Alaska's cutest critters.

Sitka has a storied past with jaw dropping scenery. Sitka is located on Baranof Island surrounded by the Sitka Sound's icy blue water. Russia controlled Alaska from the mid-1700s until the United States purchased it in 1867.

Ketchikan is a one of the best spots along the Inside Passage to explore the rich cultural sights of Native Alaskan nations. You can see intricately carved totem poles at the Totem Heritage Center and Totem Bight State Park, with working carvers and a

dance show in the clan house. Don't forget to leave time to explore the sights in the town itself, including historic Creek Street, a boardwalk built over the Ketchikan Creek, where you can shop for souvenirs, smoked salmon and local art, while exploring gold rush era tourist attractions like Dolly's House Museum.

Victoria – This is a brief stop, from 8pm – Midnight and activities off ship will be limited.

A little about your ports of call...

Hong Kong - We start our adventure in Hong Kong, one of the world's most glamorous and Cosmopolitan cities. Hong Kong is a regional and global hub for banking, shipping, fashion and food, boasting more than 60 Michelin starred restaurants.

Halong Bay, Viet Nam - Like a combination of Thailand's famous limestone Phang Nga bay and old Hong Kong's harbor with its dragon-sailed junks, Halong bay is a must see. The bay and its almost two thousand islands were declared a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1994.

Da Nang is located halfway between Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh City. It is a beautiful coastal city. This is the first place that the US Marines landed in March 1965.

Nha Trang is on the southern Vietnamese coast. Work your way forward from Buddhist temples like the 7th to 12th century Po Nagar Cham Towers and the late 19th century Long Son Pagoda, to the cities early 20th century French Gothic style cathedral.

Phu My is the gateway to Ho Chi Minh City. Formerly known as Saigon it is a fascinating mix of old and new. French -colonial architecture vies for attention with modern skyscrapers; sleet designer malls sit alongside bustling local markets.

Sihanoukville, Cambodia is home to some of Asia's most stunning coastline scenery. Renamed in 1964 for King Norodom Sihanouk it is known for its beach activities and local temples.

Laem Chabang is the port for **Bangkok**. **Thailand** is the only country in Southeast Asia (and one of the few in the world) never to have been colonized by a European power. Buddhist temples and gilded

palaces coexist with the bustle of one of Asia's major metropolises. There are few places in the world where you can spend the morning visiting centuries old temples, have lunch at one of the world's top Michelin starred restaurants and then shop for exquisite garments. And wherever you explore, you will be struck by the warm welcome you receive. "The land of smiles" is a fitting nickname for Thailand.

Koh Samui is a beautiful tropical island. It is Thailand's most famous island for many reasons reasons.

The coast is edged with vivid blue water. By contrast the islands interior includes dense jungles, ancient temples and pristine waterfalls. **Singapore** is a present-day city state. It is a modern city but maintains local neighborhoods. It has a mix of ethnic groups mainly Malays, Chinese, and Indian which makes for a vibrant cultural scene and amazing food options.



Answers to these frequently asked questions will tell you more about our company and help you enjoy your vacation to the fullest!



What does travel in the time of COVID-19 look like to you?

COVID is still with us. As we go to press, a new vaccine has been announced. We strongly urge you to consider getting it. Vaccinated travelers have a lower chance of catching COVID. We reserve the right to reinstate a vaccination requirement and anything else we feel is essential for the heath and well being of our travelers, staff and suppliers. Tour Directors have been instructed to ask travelers to "cover their mouth," to keep from spreading any type of germs around the group.

Can I find you on the web?

You bet! At <u>www.sportsleisure.com</u> you'll find all our recent publications, plus information on upcoming tours, events and more.

I hear you refer to customers as "members." Do I have to join a club to travel with you?

Absolutely not, though most travelers do elect to join the *Sports Leisure Travel Club*. Only through club membership will you receive the annual catalog, our bimonthly newsletter *The Traveler* and invitations to our special events. Additionally, only members can participate in Travel Club Gold and Day Tripper rebates, our bonus

rewards programs. A complimentary membership is extended to new and potential travelers upon request. After that, it's only \$10 per person, per year. Lifetime memberships are also available.

Are there any fees for cancellation after I make a payment?

Outside 70 days before departure (100 days on international vacations) all tour payments are refunded less a \$20 per person administrative fee upon cancellation. Within 70 days before departure refund provisions vary based on the tour and the reason for cancellation. Please refer to our *Special Vacation Notes and Information* brochure for details.

I have dietary restrictions. Is this going to be a problem?

If you have mild dietary restrictions (vegetarian, lactose and/or gluten intolerant), it is important for you to advise us at the time of registration. As you can certainly understand it is quite difficult for your Tour Director to accommodate those who wait until they are actually traveling to share their special needs. If you have severe or multiple dietary restrictions you may find this type of travel is not for you.

Can I make other special requests?

You are invited to make special requests of the airline and hotel(s) serving your vacation at the point of reservation.

The more notice we have the better our ability to accommodate you. Requests might include specific airline seating, an upgrade or the need for wheelchair assistance at airports; and at hotels a king bed or handicap-accessible room. Some special requests, like airline seating, may require additional cost. Please note we automatically request a room with two beds for those traveling double occupancy unless you tell us otherwise.

Can you explain "door-to-door service"?

Quite simply this means we will pick you up and return you to your home on all vacations of three days or longer. This service may involve a sedan, SUV, limousine or other chauffeured vehicle.

Provided by Baylight Transportation Services in the Sacramento metropolitan area, door-to-door service is included (complimentary) within these boundaries: Davis on the west, Elk Grove on the south, Auburn (95603) and Shingle Springs on the east, Woodland to the north. Service is available for an additional charge for travelers living in Galt, Stockton, Yuba City/ Marysville, Grass Valley, Winters, Vacaville, Fairfield, Placerville, Lake of the Pines/ Auburn (95602) and Colfax.

A \$100 per person credit is available for travelers to whom this service isn't available or for those who wish to opt out and meet us at the point of departure (usually the airport, train station or office). Another option for those who live in outlying areas is to overnight at a hotel located near the departure point.







On *Daycations* and overnighters motorcoaches depart from convenient neighborhood pick-up points in the greater Sacramento area. Door-to-door service is available for a fee on day and overnight trips. Call the office for details.

What can I expect from the motorcoaches you charter?

Whether locally or at fly-away destinations, we seek only the best equipment and drivers available with three things in mind: Your pleasure, your comfort and above all your safety. Onboard amenities usually include plush seating, audio and video systems, wifi, electrical outlets, climate control and a restroom. Additionally, your Tour Director is never far away with water and other refreshments.

You have assigned seating on your tours. What's that about?

We do not rotate motorcoach seats as many companies do. You are free to select the seating of your choice at the point of reservation. Single travelers are sometimes required to take available single seats to leave remaining pairs for those traveling with a friend or spouse. It's important to note many of our extended tours have limited capacity, allowing you to spread out in the rear of the coach if desired.

What about airport security restrictions? They seem to change all the time.

The Transportation Security Administration requires that you provide us your date of birth and full name as it appears on your government-issued photo identification for all vacations involving air travel. Complete passport information is additionally required

in advance for international travel. Up-todate security information can be found on the internet at www.tsa.gov, including details on how you can qualify for TSA Pre-Check. Our staff stays current on the latest regulations in order to provide you timely and accurate assistance.

Have passport rules changed?

Passports are required for all travel outside the U.S. including Canada and Mexico. If you are of foreign citizenship, we highly recommend you check with your country's embassy and follow its instructions to make certain your travel will be legal and seamless. U.S. citizens in need of a passport can pick up an application at any post office or find it online. Please allow a minimum of three months for processing. Your passport must be valid for at least six months past the scheduled ending date of your international tour.

Do I need to worry about airline baggage charges?

As each airline has different policies regarding luggage and associated charges, you may expect rules and restrictions (number of bags allowed, weight, etc.) to vary from trip to trip. You have this Sports Leisure promise: You will never pay to check your first bag on any flight on a U.S. or Canadian airline.

Each checked bag has a strict weight limit of 40 or 50 pounds (we ask that you limit to 40#, airlines are at 50#). Bags weighing more will incur additional fees or be rejected. This policy applies throughout the tour. Many "wheelie" bags and oversized carry-ons that fit in airline overhead bins cannot be accommodated within the cabin of the motorcoach. In such cases you will

be asked to check them coachside with your Tour Director. They will be tagged and available coachside at each overnight stop.

Are my payments protected when I pay for my vacation in advance?

Your deposits and final payments are held in escrow until the tour returns in full accordance with the State of California Seller of Travel Law (#2011549-40).

Can a friend from another city sign up for a *Sports Leisure* vacation, or join me for a meal or activity at one of our destinations?

Yes! We can arrange travel for friends or relatives to meet our groups from any city in the world. (We currently have over 1,000 Travel Club members who live outside the Sacramento area.) If you have someone who would like to travel with you, have them call us toll free at 1-800-951-5556. With advance notice, we are also happy to welcome your friends or relatives who may live along the tour route and wish to join us for a meal or attraction.

Can I extend my vacation to visit friends or relatives?

The answer is almost always yes, particularly if you register and make your request at least 70 days prior to departure. Many travelers take advantage of this opportunity to visit friends or relatives, or explore a destination in greater detail on their own. There could be additional charges for flight deviations, but generally they are small. If you extend your vacation, and wish to have a car waiting when you get home, airport transportation can be provided for an additional \$100 per household. Please note unique air schedules are not covered by Cancellation Protection on domestic trips.

I have some trouble walking long distances. Will I be able to participate and enjoy the trip?

Walking and some step-climbing are necessary to participate in the normal activities on our vacations. While we can do almost everything for you on a Sports Leisure vacation, the Tour Director cannot provide sustained attention to individual

clients. Please be advised that we visit many cultural sites on tour, not all of which meet A.D.A. requirements due to their historic status and/or physical layout. You must be able to get on and off the motorcoach without assistance.

Let us assure you that people with mobility restrictions are welcome on our vacations. Many of our travelers are over 70, 80 or even 90, something we keep in mind when planning our itineraries. The Tour Planner for each departure knows the itinerary well and would be happy to consult with you personally should you have questions regarding the amount of walking, elevations, etc., on a particular trip. Additionally, each trip is rated with an activity level to identify energy and fitness levels.

What if I become ill and cannot travel? Do you offer cancellation protection or travel insurance?

One or both are available on every departure. Either must be purchased at the time you make your initial tour payment. We strongly recommend you consider this optional protection. Please refer to the Special Vacation Notes and Information brochure for details. This coverage may not be available to those who have cancelled more than two tours in a 12-month period or who make their reservation less than one month prior to the departure date.

How does your company deal with "chronic complainers?"

One or two can ruin a trip for all. Sports Leisure Vacations reserves the right not to accept or retain anyone whose lack of personal hygiene or poor general behavior, in the opinion of the Tour Director, impedes the operation of the tour and/or affects the rights of other travelers. A refund of unused tour services is the limit of our liability if a person is required to leave the tour for the reasons stated above. Said passenger(s) will be responsible for any additional costs to return to the city of origin.

We want to learn, discover and have fun together. Our groups are often complimented on their positive attitude by tourism professionals and others who encounter us on the road. Life is too short for making yourself and those around you miserable due to small challenges that are bound to occur. Travel is by nature an inexact science.
