As the summer winds downs, it means it's time to start thinking about our annual tour catalog and Tour Preview Day. The catalog and the accompanying gathering

are the way we roll out a majority of our products for the 2025 calendar year. There will be more later, but this is the largest group.

This year, for the first time, our host is The Sofia, the home



of the B Street Theatre, located at 2700 Capitol Avenue. There are two sessions, with complimentary shuttle bus service and parking in the garage around the corner from the theater.

Between now and the press deadline of October 11th, we will be hard at work creating and refining the list of tours, cruises and vacation experiences we will offer -next year. A few have been announced previously, and there will be additions to the calendar in future newsletters, but this is the "big Kahuna," as they say in the islands.

We collect a \$10 admission fee, which we donate to charity. (We find by charging a small fee, the no-show rate drops dramatically, and it gives us a chance to support some deserving charitable groups. A few dollars from each of us makes a difference somewhere in our community.)

With 10am and 12:30pm start time, we will have everyone out of downtown before the afternoon rush hour. Hope you can join us.

This edition of *The Traveler* contains info on a couple of new extended tours, along with a few new day trip outings. We are also asking your opinion on a host of "teasers." Your response will tell us whether or not we should pursue these destinations, or hold them for later. (This "ask our travelers" model has served us well over the years.) Finally, the few tours from previous newsletters with space available, are listed for you to check out.

As mentioned on the front page, a reality of catalog time at *Sports Leisure* is how quickly many of the tours fill up. It's a wonderful "problem" for us, but it's never good to have loyal customers disappointed because they didn't get the trip(s) they wanted.

We've discussed a lot of potential solutions. Some involve technology (allowing you to make reservation on line). But a crush of reservations in the hours/days after Preview Day would still be a crush, whether received on line or by phone. The possibility of disappointment would not go away. Plus, the on line capability would be costly for something only needed 1-2 days a year.

We moved Tour Preview Day to a Friday this year. The venue is **The Sofia**, home of the **B Street Theater**. We are extremely proud to be presenting in this beautiful space and hope you can join us. We will be offering free shuttle buses from a variety of pick-up locations, or you can park in the same city block as the theatre downtown.

The program is a little under 2 hours and you will leave with your very own copy of our new catalog, plus knowledge about what's on its printed pages. Tour registration will open Monday morning at 9am, by phone or in person at our office. (This is the guaranteed way to get what you what, come in person to 9812 Old Winery Place, Suite 1 on Monday morning.)

Clayton just walked in and presented me with a draft of the Table of Contents for the catalog. A brief look at destinations includes the Canadian Rockies, New Mexico (without the balloons), Kings Canyon/Sequoia Nat'l Park/Wonder Valley Ranch, Niagara Falls & The Life of Lucy and old favorites like Cape Cod, Washington, DC, New York City featuring Broadway & Carnegie Hall and many more... International destinations include Switzerland and Tuscany, plus Montreal/Quebec City in Canada. Again, this preliminary list has only about ½ the catalog destinations, and we are still adding to the list..

ACTIVITY METER

The ratings can be found in the tour description in the newsletter. Match that number with this chart and you'll have an idea of the level of activity on the trip. This meter is only a guideline. With specific questions or requirements, call the office and speak to the tour planner. Each level requires your ability to board and disembark a motorcoach without assistance.

Leisurely: A tour that can be enjoyed by all requiring a minimal amount of walking on city streets and generally level surfaces. There could be a few stairs. A theater daytrip is an example.

Moderate: A tour with some walking activities, standing/strolling at attractions and museums, and some stair climbing. A daytrip to the ballpark or a museum exhibition, and short regional trips are examples. A moderate trip could include air or rail transportation and navigating through airports/stations.

Active: A tour which includes longer walks and/or walks on uneven surfaces. This is the level for most of our long-distance domestic and Canadian tours, vacations featuring national parks, and the minimum level for an overseas international trip. You should be able to walk 3-6 city blocks in a timely fashion a few times per day. You could find a flight of stairs without handrails, uneven nature trails and the like. Tours with a seaplane or jeep ride, and the ability to climb into the plane/jeep, along with longer rail journeys fall into this category.

Energetic: A tour with an emphasis on walking and other physical activities. Most overseas tours fit in this category, as well as many metropolitan domestic tours (New York and Washington, DC, especially). Expect long plane flights and walking longer distances at connections and/or customs. You should not consider a tour on this level if you need wheelchair assistance at the airport or other places.
